According to information received recently from our Bata and Malabo offices, the measure banning all vessels arriving from any African country has now been replaced by less radical steps:

**Bata:**

- Only vessels arriving via Sierra Leone, Liberia and Guinea are banned from berthing.

**Malabo:**

- Vessels arriving via Sierra Leone, Liberia and Guinea may be authorised to berth once the local health authority officer has carried out a health check. The health authority officers board with the pilots.

**Nationally**

The general travel restrictions have been softened slightly:

- Incoming and outgoing flights to/from Sao Tome et Principe, Cameroon, Ivory Coast, Ghana, Republic of Congo, Benin, Togo, Nigeria and Gabon have now resumed.
- However, issuance of visas remains suspended for those intending to travel to Equatorial Guinea from the Central and West African countries and vice versa.
- There have still not been any reported cases of Ebola in Equatorial Guinea.
