FIRST QUARTER 2019 MARITIME PIRACY UPDATE

The International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) International Maritime Bureau (IMB) has released its most recent report, Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships, for the period of January 1 to March 31, 2019. A summary of this quarterly update can be found at the the ICC's Commercial Crime Services website at https://icc-ccs.org/index.php/1268maritime-piracy-incidents-down-in-q1-2019-but-kidnapping-risk-in-gulf-of-guineapersists. While the report reveals fewer incidents of piracy and armed robbery against ships than the first three months of 2018, the ICC's emphasizes the importance of information sharing and remaining ever vigilant in high risk areas.

To gain free access to the quarterly and annual IMB piracy and armed robbery reports. Members can register at https://www.icc-ccs.org/piracy-reporting-centre/request-piracyreport. Immediate access to these reports are granted upon completion of the online application.

Members are encouraged to access these updates regularly in order to properly assess the risks associated with transiting certain sea areas. Members are also recommended to follow industry guidance as recommended in Best Management Practices to Deter Piracy and Enhance Maritime Security in the Red Sea, Gulf of Aden, Indian Ocean, and Arabian Sea (BMP5), Global Counter Piracy Guidance for Companies Masters and Seafarers, and Guidelines for Owners, Operators and Masters for protection against piracy and armed robbery in the Gulf of Guinea region.
